They are best placed to advise on; local historic environment issues and priorities, including access to data held in the HER (formerly SMR); how the policies or proposals might be tailored to minimise potential adverse impacts on the historic environment; the nature and design of any required mitigation measures; and opportunities for securing wider benefits for the future conservation and management of historic assets.

We should like to stress that this opinion is based on the information set out in the document dated January 2018. To avoid any doubt, this does not affect our obligation to provide further advice and, potentially, object to specific proposals which may subsequently arise (either as a result of this consultation or in later versions of the LTP) where we consider that, despite the SA/SEA, these would have an adverse effect upon the historic environment.
