The meeting point for Heritage Buddies is at the castle's Visitor Centre (pictured).

What is available at Nottingham Castle for you to enjoy?

Inside the Ducal Palace there are a range of galleries and exhibitions to enjoy, including the Lace Gallery, the art collections in the Long Gallery, the Museum of the Mercian Regiment, the Rebellion Gallery and the Robin Hood Adventures, which contains interactive and immersive displays.

You can also visit the newly refurbished Brewhouse Yard Museum exploring the history of some of the families who lived there over the centuries. At Brewhouse Yard you can also find the city's only accessible caves.

Outdoors visitors can enjoy the castle's attractive grounds and enjoy the panoramic views from the top of the hill.

- Grounds or Castle museum and galleries visit
- Brewhouse Yard Museum visit
- Cave tours (additional £5 charge)
- Robin Hood Experience and adventure play area for children
- Volunteering opportunities speak to volunteer lead.

What we love about Nottingham Castle and why we'd love you to visit

With over a thousand years of history on this site we think Nottingham Castle is a very special place.

There may not be much left of the medieval castle, but the 17th Ducal Palace is crammed with exhibits and art works which tell the story of this extraordinary site.

We'd love you to come and visit us, and share with you the culture and heritage of this amazing place.

Facilities available and access considerations:

Opening times:

- Grounds, Museum and Gallery: 10am-5pm
- Brewhouse Yard Cottages: weekend, bank and school holidays, 11am-4pm
- Cafes, shop and toilets: 10am-5pm

Entry charges:

£12 entry fee. This is valid for a full year with unlimited return visits.

Travel:

The Castle is within walking distance of the city's train station and is just five minutes' walk from Nottingham's Old Market Square. The city also has an eco-friendly public transport system, so getting here is simple, however you choose to travel.

Parking vehicles is not possible on site.

- The site and museum are wheelchair accessible. Please note there is a steep hill from the main entrance to the museum.
- There are two cafés, selling food and drinks.
- Accessible toilet facilities.
