

## SOC consultation

1) At what level do you use SOC?

*At Historic England we use 4 digit SOC in order to identify vital occupations in the heritage sector.*

2) Describe how you use SOC in your role.

*SOCs are vital to provide a quantitative understanding of the breadth and scale of employment and skills in the heritage sector. The historic environment is intrinsically linked to economic activity and supports sometimes very specialist roles that are vital to for example the repair and maintenance of the historic environment. This is vital as for example, over 28% of the residential stock in this country is traditionally constructed.*

*Historic England uses the 4 digit SOC codes to understand the scale of employment in the sector and the skills distribution of the heritage sector workforce. We develop employment estimates using a detailed SIC-SOC mapping. This methodology enables us to estimate the contribution of the heritage sector to employment and GVA generation.*

3) Are there specific areas of the SOC that you would like to see considered for additional detail?

*The heritage sector is diverse and multidimensional with heritage workers distributed across many different areas; we would like to see more specific detail in the following ones:*

- *Managers, Directors and Senior Officials*
- *natural and social sciences professions,*
- *engineers*
- *architects, town planners and surveyors,*
- *librarians and related professionals,*
- *science engineering and production technicians*
- *draughtpersons and related architectural technicians,*
- *artistic, media and literary occupations*
- *construction and buildings trades,*
- *construction and building trades supervisors,*
- *agricultural and related trends*
